HOME AND COMMUNITY CARE SERVICES ARE STILL AVAILABLE


STAFF ARE AVAILABLE TO ASSIST WITH SHOPPING AND ALSO LAWN MOWING.

BADAC Covid 19—Recovery Strategy

From May 12th, BADAC commenced a 3 Stage plan for business recovery from the Covid 19 Shutdown. This plan is subject to change and is dependent on Federal and State Advice on lifting of restrictions.

There are 3 Stages to this strategy and are as follows:

STAGE 1: (May 12th 2020):

- * BADAC main doors remain closed. Medical doors will be opened for clients with appointments but will remain closed.
- Reimplementation of home visits (Emergency/high priority clients only). PPE and safe hygiene and social distancing
 measures will be required. Staff will undergo testing for Covid 19. Staff to check client's temperature prior to entering a home.
- Staff will remain working from home unless conducting a home visit or for necessary work commitments. Non emergency personnel will remain working from home.
- Communication to the Aboriginal community will continue by utilising social media, text and phone calls.

STAGE 2: (June 1st 2020 approximately)

- * BADAC main doors remain closed. Medical doors will be opened for clients with appointments but will remain closed.
- Reimplementation of home visits for high priority clients. PPE and safe hygiene and social distancing measures will be required. Staff will undergo testing for Covid 19. Staff to check client's temperature prior to entering a home.
- Staff will remain working from home unless conducting a home visit or for necessary work commitments. A working roster will be developed allowing for staff to rotate working from home and on site.
- Communication to the Aboriginal community will continue by utilising social media, text and phone calls.

STAGE 3: (July 1st 2020 approximately)

- BADAC doors will be open to the Community, however strict hygiene and cleaning measures will be in place
- Any staff or Community member presenting with cold and flu symptoms will be unable to attend BADAC site
- Home Visits will resume
- Staff will share working from home and onsite
- Employees will be able to travel for work purposes for workplace needs
- Communication to the Aboriginal community will continue as normal.
- Community events and large gatherings will now be able to occur
